In the next 5 years, Cure Blindness Project will change lives in the following ways*:

3 MILLION

people will have their vision screened

600,000+

will have their sight restored through surgery

TRUE VALUE

The provision of high-quality eye care can change entire communities:

- Cataract treatment on average provides a 20X return for every dollar spent – one of the highest ROIs of any disease intervention
- Addressing eye health in working-age adults can enhance productivity by 22%
- Poor eye health is linked to conditions like depression and can increase mortality risk by up to 2.6 times
- Good vision enables quality of life we hear countless stories of individuals who have lost their ability to care for loved ones or enjoy activities; with restored sight, they return to the lives they cherish







Three priority areas that will accelerate our impact and achieve our goals in 2024-2028.

- 1 Focus on self-sustaining solutions
- 2 Elevate quality
- 3 Expand scope of care



PRIORITY 1

FOCUS ON SELF-SUSTAINING SOLUTIONS To enable countries to end avoidable blindness, we must build systems that continue to operate without ongoing philanthropy/direct support. This requires the development of both human resources and financial sustainability:

- Continued focus on training across levels and equipment to build local systems
- Focused portfolio management to maximize efficiency of resources by thoughtfully deploying resources across countries at different levels of development and need
- Clear criteria and assessment to determine the most appropriate and impactful support to advance a country or partner's level of development
- Proactive planning for exit strategies that enable ongoing local leadership as a goal

To ensure Cure Blindness Project is positioned to continue its impactful work, we must strengthen the organization and position it to deliver long-term impact:

- Systems development to most efficiently manage resources and processes
- Focus on building and strengthening our human resources
- Catalytic fundraising to expand the scope of work and ensure the longevity of our efforts





PRIORITY 2

ENSURE QUALITY

To truly end avoidable blindness and and enable everyone everywhere to live without the restrictions of vision loss, it is imperative that care meet the global standards for effective care*:

- Cure Blindness Project will be a thought leader to develop globally accepted best practices for clinical care and patient services
- Quality will be embedded as a cornerstone in all our training and patient care programs
- Quality standards will be measured and reported to identify continuous improvement opportunities for growth
- Targeted infrastructure investments will enable significant quality gains in core geographies

OF CARE



- Continued support of training and equipment for broader range of subspecialty areas


WHAT IS DIFFERENT IN THIS STRATEGIC PLAN?
